- Gate tickets are not required for ages 12 and under. Free gate tickets for ages 90 and over or active duty military. (Proof of age/ID card must be provided upon request).
- Youth are age 13 - 25 years old. Birth date required at time of purchase. For ticketing purposes, your age is the age you are when your ticket begins.
- One week is seven consecutive days (i.e.: Sat-Sat; Mon-Mon; 12th-19th).
- Weekly gate tickets are valid from 7 a.m. (on your arrival date) until 10 a.m. (on your date of departure). Extensions are subject to additional fees.
- **Ticket order confirmation will be sent via e-mail. All tickets will be mailed unless ordered within a week of your arrival. These tickets will be held at Will Call.**
- All tickets become non-refundable after June 25, 2011.
- **Once your tickets arrive, check them for accuracy.** If there is a problem, please notify the Box Office ASAP. Please read the back of your tickets for important information.
- Preferred Floor Seating for select Amphitheater Specials is available for an additional \$15 fee. Every person wishing to be seated in this reserved section must purchase the \$15 ticket, including children 12 and under. These reserved seats are on the floor section beginning in the front of the stage going back and are limited to 500. This ticket guarantees a seat in the reserved floor section on a first-come, first-served basis until the start of the performance. These tickets go on sale starting March 3, 2011.
- A \$10.00 service fee applies to any change requested after the initial order has been processed. No exchanges are allowed if a performance is sold out.
- A \$5.00 processing fee will be added to each order placed.

- ◆ Slip or ramp assignments for Institution-owned docks are subject to a registration fee AND a mooring fee and are billed separately on receipt.
- ◆ Slip assignments for privately owned docks are subject to a registration fee only.
- ◆ Small boat = 12 feet long and under                      Large boat = over 12 feet long
- ◆ Ramps are for smaller boats (Sunfish, rowboat, etc.). Smaller vessels that share a dock, including canoes and jet skis, are subject to one mooring fee for the shared dock space and a separate registration fee for each vessel.
- ◆ Catamarans and Hobie Cats require two ramps (one registration fee, two mooring fees each).
- ◆ The length of the docking pass must match an accompanying gate pass.
- ◆ **Full season renewals and new full season requests accepted until May 6, 2011. New full season requests will be assigned after May 20, 2011.**
- ◆ Changes or weekly requests will only be accepted after May 20, 2011 by calling the Central Dock office directly at 716.357.6288.

Synopsis: The principles of good versus evil are embodied in the fanciful tale of Prince Tamino as he proves his worthiness through tests of silence, fire and water. Tamino, with the "assistance" of Papageno, the charming and naïve bird-catcher, remains faithful to Sarastro, High Priest of the Sacred Order, to win the love of Pamina, daughter of the Queen of the Night. The light of goodness dispels the evil of the darkness. ***The Magic Flute*** was Mozart's final opera. Its mix of fantasy, philosophy and Masonic rituals has made it a favorite since its premiere in Vienna in 1791. It includes spoken dialogue and singing. The inspired combination of heavenly music and earthly comedy is perfect for the entire family.

Length: 160 minutes in two acts (approx.)

***On July 9, Chautauqua Opera Company will join with the Chautauqua Symphony Orchestra in a production of Luisa Miller by Giuseppe Verdi on the Amphitheater stage. Luisa Miller will be performed in Italian with English supertitles. Seating for this event will be available to anyone holding a valid gate pass for the evening of July 9.***

based on Schiller's *Kabale und Liebe*  
(*Intrigue and Love*).

Synopsis: Three acts titled "Love," "Intrigue" and "Poison" tell the story of Luisa Miller, who loves Carlo (in reality Rodolfo), but is pursued by Wurm. She refuses his attentions. Both fathers make disastrous deals and decisions. She is lied to and betrayed by both Wurm and Rodolfo. In the end, both Luisa and Rodolfo die of poison as Rodolfo visits his fatal vengeance upon Wurm. The fathers are left to grieve.

Length: 130 minutes in three acts (approx.)

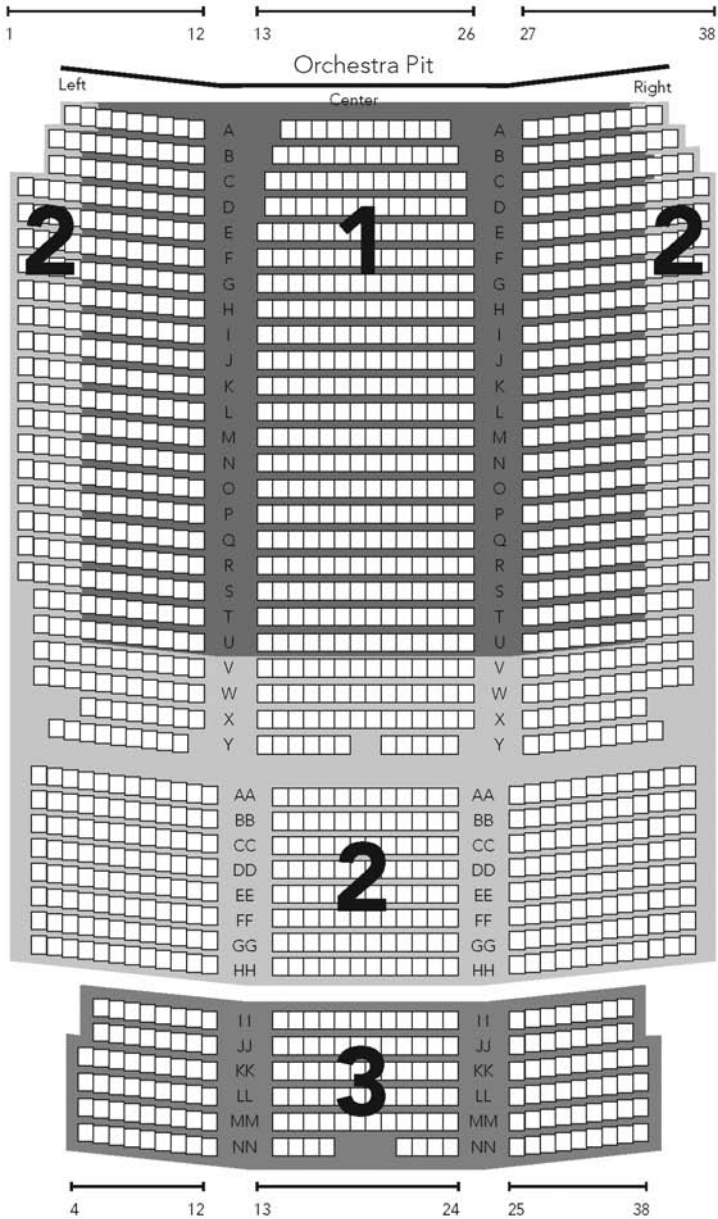

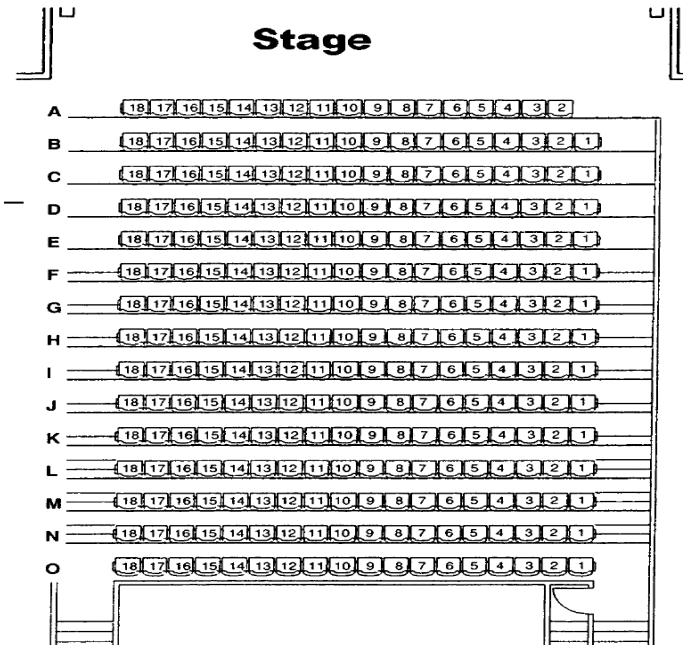

**Fees:** Please refer to the fee schedules on the following pages. **Registration in these programs does not need to be consecutive weeks in order to receive the multiple-week rate.** Fees for first and additional children should be determined as follows:

- ◆ Oldest child or the child enrolled for the longest period of time attending ANY of the youth programs is considered the "first" child.
- ◆ "Additional" child fees apply only to the other children in the immediate family attending Children's School, Group One, Boys' and Girls' Club, or any combination of these programs.

**Children's School**

Chautauqua Children's School is a developmental preschool for youth ages 3-5. The school is located at the corner of Hurst and Pratt avenues and operates six classrooms 9 a.m. - noon, Monday through Friday.

Each classroom is staffed with four leaders, including certified teachers, college-age early childhood majors, and high school students. The teachers work as a team and share classroom responsibilities.

Please note that a child must be at least **3 years of age** at the time he or she attends the Children's School and **must be** toilet trained.

**Group One**

Group One is designed for children who will be entering first grade in the fall. This special full-day program (9 a.m. - noon and 2 - 4 p.m.) is held Monday through Friday and utilizes the Children's School and Sheldon Hall of Education facilities and schedule in the morning and the Boys' and Girls' Club facilities and schedule in the afternoon. It is intended as a transition between these two programs and includes active play, art activities, swimming/waterfront programs and special events.

The children receive an orientation to both facilities during the first morning.

Group One is staffed with qualified college graduates, college-age assistants and high school-age assistants. The same leaders stay with the children throughout the day. At Boys' and Girls' Club, Group One staff is joined by certified waterfront counselors for swimming or other lake-front activities.

## Boys' & Girls' Club

The Boys' and Girls' Club is a day camp program for youth entering second grade through tenth grade in the fall. Located at the south end of the grounds on the lakefront, Club provides a diverse program that includes field activities, swimming (instructional and free swim), canoeing, kayaking, sailing, nature, crafts, individual and team sports, music and experiences in the arts. In addition, Club offers many special events and presentations focusing on areas such as science, music, dance, opera, and outdoor education.

Boys' and Girls' Club is in session 9 a.m. - noon and 2 p.m. - 4 p.m., Monday through Friday

Club is a registered day camp and operates under the guidelines and regulations of the New York State Department of Health.

The Boys' and Girls' Club staff includes certified teachers, other college graduates and adult professionals, and college and high school students. Each group is staffed with a head counselor and one or two assistant counselors. The counselors-in-training program provides skill-building and practical experiences for 16 year-olds preparing to become counselors.

## ARE YOU BRINGING BICYCLES TO CHAUTAUQUA?

In order to better regulate bicycle traffic at Chautauqua and to provide for better enforcement of our rules and regulations about bicycles, the Institution has adopted a new policy which requires the registration of all bicycles. There is no charge for registration and registration stickers will be mailed with the rest of your ticket order. Please refer to the ticket order form to register your bicycles. **Registration stickers from previous summers are valid. Do not request new stickers.**

The Institution's rules on bicycles are as follows:

- ◆ Registration: Bicycle registration is required.
- ◆ Minors: A parent of any minor and the guardian of any minor ward shall not authorize or knowingly permit any minor or minor ward to violate any provisions of this article.
- ◆ Operating Conditions: Bicycles shall be maintained in good, safe operating condition and shall have adequate brakes, a bell, or other signaling device, rear reflector, and a headlight. Operators under fourteen years of age must wear a protective helmet as required by New York State law.
- ◆ Prohibited Areas: Bicycles shall not be ridden on walks reserved for pedestrian use.
- ◆ Speed: Bicycles shall be operated safely and at a speed no greater than is reasonable and prudent under conditions then existing, and in no event at more than 12 miles per hour.
- ◆ Right of Way: Bicycles shall always give the right of way to pedestrians.
- ◆ Traffic Signals: All traffic signs, signals, and regulations shall be observed by operators of bicycles.
- ◆ Violation: In the event of any violation of Article IX of these rules and regulations, the Institution may issue a bicycle violation ticket requiring a fee to be paid within a designated time. The Institution may also impound any bicycle which is operated in violation of Sections 1, 3, 4, 5 or 6 of this article pending arrangement for the correction of the violation.
